### **Bear Necessities**

Recently, a bear has been seen on Arden Lane.

The keys to lowering the risk of having a bear invade your home space are to ensure there are no easy food sources and to use deterrents to scare off the bear if you see it. This does not mean to put yourself in jeopardy or chase the bear, but use loud noises, hit the panic alarm on your car from the safety of inside your house, etc. There are products on the market you may find useful as well such as bear spray, unwelcome mats (electrified mats), night guard lights (flashing red lights), and many more. If the bear is uncomfortable and there is no food reward, it will move out of the area. It is important to eliminate food sources; clean off your grill and remove any drippings after use, keep trash, bird seed, pet food, and any other food attractants secure to ensure a bear does not get access at all. It is a community effort, if a bear finds food at the neighbors it will remain in the general area.

### **Community Matters**

- Trash All trash must be placed in containers and stored out of view of the street and the side of adjoining properties at all times except on trash collection days. Containers may only be placed at the curbside in the late evening the day before or early morning the day of collection. Containers and any uncollected trash or debris should be moved off of the street by the evening of the day of collection.
- Trick-or-Treater Safety Use the buddy system, never trick or treat alone. Use flashlights, glow sticks or reflective tape to make it easier to be seen at night. Do not go to any dark, unlit houses. Do not go inside a stranger's house. Cross at crosswalks and make eye contact with drivers before you cross the street. Walk, don't run! Pay attention when walking past driveways to make sure cars aren't pulling in or out. Wear non-toxic make up instead of a mask, which may hinder sight. If you wear a mask make sure it fits well. Costumes and shoes should fit to avoid trips and falls. Costume accessories such as swords shouldn't be sharp. They should be soft and flexible. Do not eat any candy until it has been checked. Eat only factory wrapped candy and stay away from homemade treats or candy from another country. Keep an eye out and drive safe!

### **Maintenance Musts**

September and October are good months to tackle those end-of-the-year maintenance projects before cold weather sets in. Over seeding of lawns and application of pre-emergent weed killer/fertilizers can be performed through mid-October for a better lawn come 2020. Check for cracking in caulk seals around doors and windows and you may even want to consider having a professional inspect your roof for damaged shingles or loose flashing before the first snowfall.
