There will be **no trash pick-up on Friday, November 24, 2017** due to the Thanksgiving holiday. The **trash will be picked up on Tuesday, November 28, 2017.**

If you set your trash out on the wrong day, do not leave it there! Put it away in its regular storage location until it is time to put it out for the next trash pick-up!

Fall Extra Trash Pick-up

The Town of Warrenton Fall Clean-up extra trash pick-up is scheduled for Waterloo Court on Tuesday, October 17, 2017. **Please have items you want to have removed, placed at the curb by 8:00 A.M. on that day.** No return trips can be made.

Regarding items containing freon, such as refrigerators and air conditioners, a local recycling company takes the items and drains the freon at no cost, so that the owner setting out the item, does not have to do this, or pay a fee to the Town to do this. If you put out a refrigerator or freezer, please do remove the door.

Also, again this year, the Town crews will take away old tires. There is a charge of \$3.00 per tire, but this is the same fee which you would pay if you took the tires to the landfill yourself. This fee must be paid in advance. Contact Public Works at 540-347-1858 to arrange to pay this fee.

Items such as TVs, computers, monitors, copiers, fax machines, microwave ovens, printers, battery packs, mattresses and box springs, or any type of liquid chemicals or paint, will not be picked up. They must be taken to the County landfill, where they can be recycled. A modest fee is charged for recycling some of these items, and some may only be left on certain days of the week. Free Trash Bags

The Town of Warrenton gives out one free box of 100 trash bags to each business or residence in the Town, each year, at the beginning of October. Also, the Town furnishes residents and businesses with bags for recycling. This year, the bags may be picked up beginning on Monday, October 2, 2017.

The bags are available at the Warrenton Visitors' Center, located at 33 North Calhoun Street, seven days a week, from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. You will need to bring some type of identification which shows the address of your business or shop in the Town, in order to receive the bags.

The recycling bags (which are usually blue) are to be used for recycling only. They will not be picked up if used as trash bags.

Warrenton Farmers' Market

The Warrenton Farmers' Markets are still open! The Wednesday Market has been held at the WARF this year, and is larger in size than in previous years. It is open from 8:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M., through October 25th.

The Saturday market remains located in the municipal parking lot at the corner of Lee and 5th Streets. It, too, has been enlarged in size, and also in scope. Special Kids and Family Days are being held on the first Saturday of each month. There will be free activities, entertainment, and food tastings. This market's hours are 8:00 A.M. until noon, through November 18th.

For those who must be in their offices or shops on a Saturday, a walk to the Saturday market might make a pleasant break, and you might even find something tasty for a special lunch treat. Also, fall is the season for different vegetables to be offered, especially root vegetables, which might inspire cooks to produce hearty soups or stews to take away the increasing chill in the air.

If you bring a pet to work with you, be sure to pick up after it when you take it outdoors and do not let it become an annoyance to the other owners or their clients, through excessive barking.
