If you would like to celebrate the holiday by attending a display of fireworks, you might be interested in the hometown celebration being planned again this year by the Town of Warrenton Committee on Health, Parks, and Recreation. This event is named Warrenton Town Limits, and is to be held on Friday, June 30, 2017, at the Warrenton Aquatic & Recreation Facility (WARF). It is a family celebration of everything Warrenton. This year's event includes live music, a family fun zone with inflatables, vendors selling food, games, swimming, a fireworks display, and much more. The event is free, and everybody is welcome! To Keep Your Cool

It is important to see that the condenser is functioning properly, to avoid "freeze-ups," and that the condensate line is clear, to avoid drips and puddles, which can cause damage to adjacent areas.

Warrenton Farmers' Market

The Warenton Farmers' Markets are now open for the season! The Wednesday Market has been relocated to the WARF, and has been enlarged in size. It is open from 8:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M., through October 25th.

The Saturday market remains located in the municipal parking lot at the corner of Lee and 5th Streets. It, too, has been enlarged in size, and also in scope. Special Kids and Family Days are being held on the first Saturday of each month. There will be free activities, entertainment, and food tastings. This market's hours are 8:00 A.M. until noon, through November 18th.

For those who must be in their offices or shops on a Saturday, a walk to the Saturday market might make a pleasant break, and you might even find something tasty for a special lunch treat.
