





Your Public Works Department would like to thank everyone for their understanding as we become compliant with the Town's refuse collection ordinance and educate you along the way. It goes a long way to keep Warrenton clean and safe; while providing a service to our community.

# As a reminder, here are the requirements for standard household trash pickup:

- All trash must be properly bagged and placed in containers curbside for pick up- anything not bagged, in a container or not curbside, will not be picked up
- All grass and leaves must be bagged- except for leaves during leaf cleanup, which starts in November with details to follow
- Tree limbs must be no longer than 8 feet long and no more than 8 inches in diameter, stacked to be easily loaded into a chipper, with no debris (grass, leaves, root balls, or other debris) in the piles. Please stack piles with the cut ends on one side

### The following items WILL NOT be picked up:

- Anything not meeting the above standards
- Hazardous waste, paints, paint thinners, automotive fluids, etc.
- Broken or exposed sharp objects
- Earth, rocks, or building materials
- Batteries, tires, furniture, appliances, auto parts
- Vines, stems herbaceous and non-woody plant materials with thin stems will not be collected - these must be taken directly to the landfill
- Construction debris or any items which is left by a contractor
- Stumps or root balls
- Items which require extra reaching, sifting through piles, or materials to grab

Your Public Works Department would like to thank everyone for their understanding as we become compliant with the Town's recycling collection ordinance and educate you along the way. It goes a long way to keep Warrenton clean and safe; while providing a service to our community.

## As a reminder, here are the requirements for standard recycling pickup:

- Glass is NOT accepted
- Plastic Plastic bottles, bowls, cups, plates, containers, etc. that are imprinted with either the number one (1) or the number (2). These numbers are typically found on the bottom of the item surrounded by a recycling symbol
- Steel and Aluminum Only steel, aluminum, and tin food and beverage containers. No Styrofoam, no aerosol cans, no plastic bags (grocery bags), and no cardboard or paper in the recycle bags
  - Remove all lids and tops and put them in the garbage
  - Rinse all containers to reduce odors and attraction to insects and rodents
  - Crush all items whenever possible
  - Place all these items into the Recycle bag and tie the bag at the top
- Cardboard Corrugated Cardboard
- Remove ALL packing materials, including newspaper, styrofoam, peanuts, shredded paper, wood pieces, etc
- Break down as many boxes as possible and put them into one larger empty box. This is for corrugated boxes only—no cereal boxes, cake boxes, 12 pack soda cases, etc
- For corrugated cardboard, you must be on the weekly list for pick up. To get on the list, contact Public Works at (540) 347-1858 any time before the day of collection. If you need a pick-up every week, you will be placed on the permanent list
- Mixed Paper Newspaper, Magazines, and Phone Books
  - Tie up bundles with string, or place in paper bags, NOT PLASTIC bags

The following items are not picked up curbside; however, a drop-off container is located at 360 Falmouth Street for mixed office paper.

### Mixed Office Paper:

- Computer Paper
- Paper Envelopes
- Sticky Notes
- Colored paper, fax, blueprints
- Junk mail not shiny or containing wax type coating
- Office paper white paper, stationery, index cards, plain bond, tablet sheets, etc.
- Shredded paper

#### **Not Acceptable:**

- Newspapers and Magazines there is a curbside collection for this
- Telephone Books Place at curbside with newspapers
- Thin cardboard
- Glossy paper with wax type coating
- Ground wood paper
- Paper clips, rubber bands, and staples
